

In many countries, Muslims cover their heads. Some men wear a cap.





#### Other clothes

Clothing worn by all people reflects the climate in which they live. Many Muslims live in hot climates. Their clothing needs to be light. White clothing is cooler than dark clothing. Their clothing also needs to protect them from the sun.

Traditionally, clothing was made from cotton. It was a cool fabric to wear in a hot country. Some clothing was made from linen. Linen is made from plant fibres. Today, Muslims still wear clothes made from cotton and linen but also wear synthetic and woolen fabrics.

# Family life

Muslims believe that the family is the cornerstone of their society. In the past, Muslim families were extended. There could be three or more generations living in one house. Some Muslim families still live like that but others are different.

### Marriage



Marriage is important in Muslim families. A wedding is a time of great celebration. Some brides decorate their feet and hands with designs using henna. Henna is made from the leaves of the henna shrub. The leaves are dried and then pounded into powder. This powder is then used as red dye.

### Children

Muslim children attend classes to learn Arabic. In Canada, these classes are after their regular school. Muslims believe that is important for all Muslims to be able to read and write in Arabic. The Qur'an, the book that tells about Islam, is written in Arabic.

The Arabic alphabet has 28 letters.

When you read Arabic, you start at the right hand side and read towards the left. When you write words, you begin at the right hand side of the line and move left.
